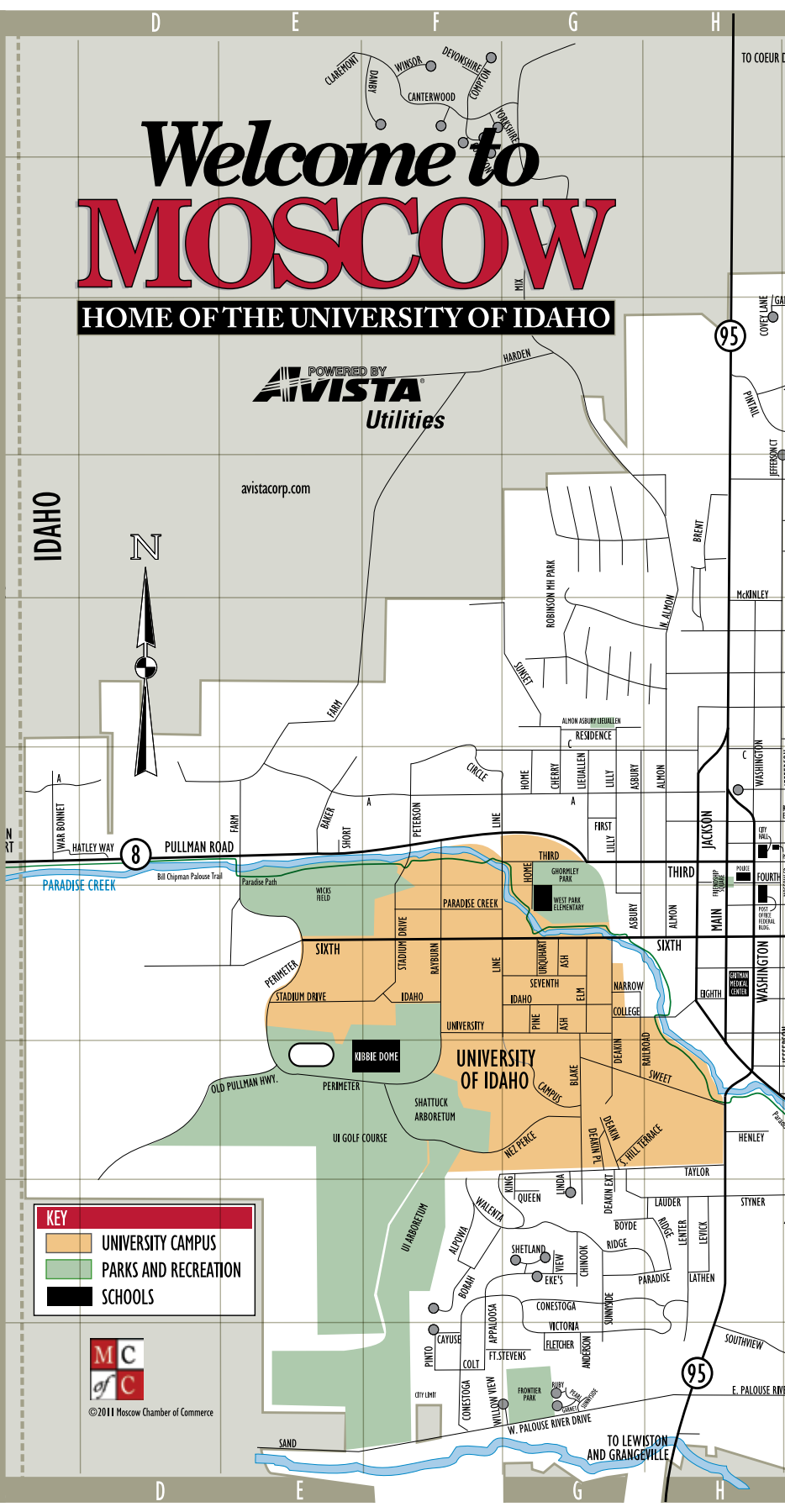

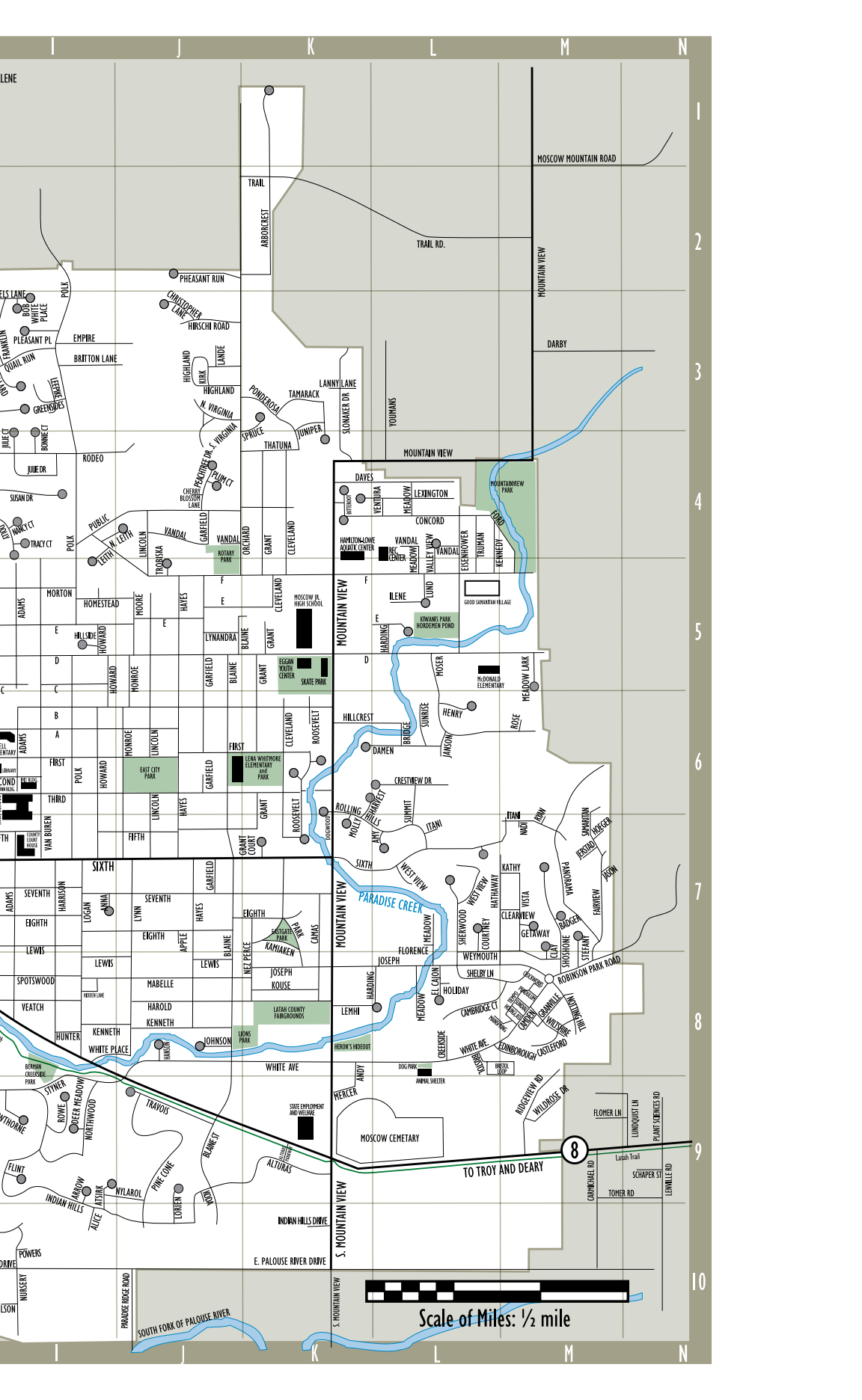

Our downtown gathering spot is called Friendship Square – a perfect illustration of who we've always been. We know you will love it here!

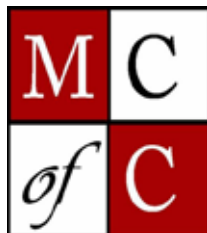

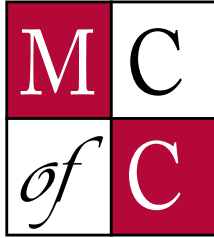

# IN THE BEGINNING

Issac Stevens, the first territorial governor of Washington, penned the first written description of the Palouse country, while surveying for railroad placement in the early 1850's. Today, mesmerizing beauty and a sweeping landscape of rolling hills and plateaus greet visitors to this distinctive region north of the Snake River in Southeast Washington and North Central Idaho.

This is the place simply to drive leisurely along the gently curving highways, sprinkled with antique shops and wineries, with easy access to hiking and biking and above all, photography. If you ever needed to stop the world and relax, this is the place for it.

The land was originally occupied by the Palus tribe, renowned as expert equestrians. The source of the word,

Palouse most likely comes from the name of the major village of the Palouse Indians. The name is the Sehaptin (Indian) word for the village, “palus” which means “something sticking down in the water.” The village was located at the confluence of the Palouse and Snake Rivers, and the something sticking down in the water was a large rock. The Palouse believed the rock to be a solidified heart of Beaver who played an important role in their religious beliefs.

The Palouse region has since become known for growing wheat and legumes and is home to small towns with a rich history and charm. Pullman, Washington and Moscow, Idaho are the main hub communities.

Settlers arrived in 1871, to homestead or buy the abundant government-owned prairie grasslands so valuable for farming. Originally Moscow was named “Paradise Valley” however there was already a town with that name in Idaho Territory. Moscow’s name was chosen

by Postmaster Samuel Neff because it reminded him of his hometown of Moscow, Pa. In 1875, the city's first store was opened on what is now Main Street. The arrival of the Oregon Railway and Navigation Company's line in 1885 sparked a typical railroad boom town. Moscow was incorporated in 1887

followed by the creation of Latah County in 1888 with Moscow as the county seat. In 1889 Moscow was chosen as the site for a land-grant institution, the University of Idaho, which propelled the city into a trading and population center for the county. Idaho achieved statehood in 1890.

## CULTIVATING THE PALOUSE

The rolling hills of the Palouse offer a unique agricultural experience for local farmers. In the spring, the loess hills are bright green and speckled with an array of beautiful wildflowers. Before harvest in the fall, the hills are brushed with the golden colors of ripe crops, and some fields are filled with bright yellow canola. Area crops include wheat, barley, peas, lentils, chickpeas, garbanzo beans, and canola.

Peas, lentils and chickpeas have been grown on the Palouse for over 100 years, generally as rotation crops with wheat. Farmers appreciate the special nitrogen-fixing properties of these three crops, whose roots gather nitrogen from the air and fix it into the soil surrounding the roots. This natural process helps

reduce the farmers' dependence on commercial fertilizers, and this nitrogen benefit remains even after harvest, giving a boost to the wheat crop that is planted on that same field in the next season.

Grouped together, peas, lentils and chickpeas are called the cool-season pulses: pulses is the term used to describe legumes that are used primarily for food, and cool-season refers to their tolerance for cool weather at the beginning of the growing season. Depending on the soil moisture and temperature, cool-season pulses may be planted anywhere from early April to early May, and the plants generally flower about eight to 10 weeks after planting. After flowering, seedpods appear, and the seeds inside the pods are allowed to mature and dry on the vine prior to harvesting. Pea harvest takes place first, usually starting in mid-July, followed by lentil harvest in August and chickpea harvest in September. After harvest, the cool-season pulses are stored in bins and then shipped to buyers throughout

the marketing year. Some of our harvest stays here in the U.S. to be used in canned soups and other prepared foods, or sold dry in packaged form for home cooking — and a lot of our chickpeas are processed into hummus refrigerated snack spreads. However, most of our cool-season pulse harvest is exported to other markets. Our leading export markets include India, China, the EU, the Philippines, and Peru.

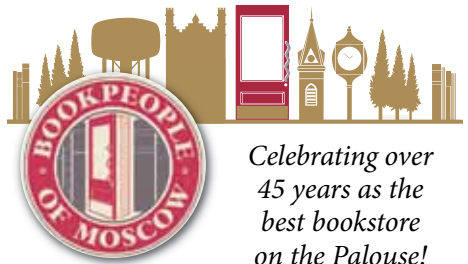

## VISIT OUR NEIGHBORS

Moscow has great neighboring communities, and they offer a variety of great things to do, see, taste and experience.

The area around **Bovill, Idaho** was first homesteaded in 1890, and around 1900 was purchased by a wealthy Englishman, Hugh Bovill. He and his family made Bovill their home for more than a decade, during which time they built a post office, general store, and a hotel to accommodate hunters and anglers seeking to enjoy the region's riches. While lumber is the primary industry, Bovill is nestled in a beautiful mountain meadow, with opportunities for great camping, hunting and fishing available in all directions. Moose Creek Reservoir is a local favorite, offering a peaceful location for camping, fishing and recreation for the entire family. Camas Prairie Winery also has a tasting room located in their downtown.

In the 1880's and 1890's the area around **Deary, Idaho** was homesteaded, predominately by Scandinavians from the Midwest. In 1905 Potlatch Lumber

Company engineers decided to locate a station of the Washington, Idaho & Montana Railway on this site, and the company's general manager William Deary worked to establish a townsite. The mountain north of town that rises 1,100 feet above its surroundings is known as Potato Hill (elev. 4,017). It is a volcanic vent of undetermined age. Early residents called it Spud Hill, and the most optimistic referred to it as Mt. Deary. Two forested reservoirs are nearby and offer camping, hunting, fishing, and hiking.

Visit scenic **Genesse, Idaho**, and enjoy the historic buildings downtown, take a country drive to admire the beautiful rolling hills of wheat, barley, garbanzo beans, peas and lentils, or shop at the local antique store. Another great adventure is to visit the national historic site, White Springs Ranch. Take a trip back in time and see the circa 1876 log cabin and the 1884-1904 farm home. Genesse Community Day, the first Saturday of June, draws families to enjoy the car show, basketball tournament, quilt show, or the Cow Creek Run.



enjoying homemade pizza for the entire family. Visitors are always welcome to tour the privately-owned Castle Museum, which was constructed by Abraham A. Adams in the early 1900s. Today, the museum's rooms are filled with a collection of antiques and artifacts relating to local and Pacific Northwest history. Visitors can also venture to Colter's Creek Winery for a wine tasting.

Thomas Kirby founded **Kendrick, Idaho**, in 1889. Kendrick's rich history can still be enjoyed today. Visitors can admire many of the historic buildings on Main Street, tour the Bethany and Leland Churches, pull over to investigate the basalt columns that

many university students travel to see, or shop at one of the many antique shops downtown. Kendrick also welcomes visitors from all over the country to their annual Locust Blossom Festival, which is held the last Saturday of May.

**Potlatch Idaho**, is one of the most unique towns in all of Idaho. In 1905, Weyerhaeuser-organized Potlatch Lumber Company began building the largest white pine lumber mill of the day. To accommodate the many hundreds of workers needed to run the mill, the company built its own town, complete with houses, stores, schools, churches, and a gymnasium. Visitors today will find many remnants of company town days, such as rows of tidy, identical homes, though the company long ago divested its interests. To learn more, visit the Potlatch Historical Society, housed in the beautifully restored W.I.&M. Depot. The spectacular scenery surrounding Potlatch consists of deep pine forests and grassy meadows, clear rivers and babbling mountain streams, providing year-round recreational opportunities. Potlatch provides excellent accommodations for

hunting, fishing, camping, and other recreational activities.

Eight miles west of Moscow, is charming **Pullman, Washington**. With a population of 33,000, Pullman offers spectacular natural beauty plus urban amenities due to Washington State University, which occupies one-third of the town. Pullman has a fresh, small town feel, and the locals are welcoming and excited that you are exploring their town.

Visitors can also explore **Troy, Idaho**, a town that played an important role in the early commercial history of Latah County. Thanks to the arrival of the railroad around 1890, Troy served as a center of trade for both agriculture and lumber through the first decade of the 20th century. Today the community of Troy is a fun place for visitors to make a pit stop and check out some of the local shops downtown, take a picnic to the park, or enjoy the Latah Trail that connects Troy to Moscow. ### UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO

---

Founded in 1889, the University of Idaho has for more than 125 years been the state's public land-grant, national research university. Nearly 12,000 students, pursuing one or several of more than 250 degree options, contribute to the vibrant life of the beautiful main campus in Moscow. Recognized by Forbes Magazine as among the top 25 "Best Value Colleges" in the nation, the statewide impact of Idaho's leading university includes centers in Boise, Coeur d'Alene, and Idaho Falls, as well as research and extension programs across the state.

The Moscow campus features many iconic buildings and an original Olmsted Brothers landscape design. The landmark Administration Building anchors campus, fronted by a picturesque lawn with towering trees and the school's famed "Hello Walk" pathway. Memorial Gym, built in 1928 in honor of servicemen killed in World War I, is still

home to Vandal volleyball and basketball, and the many elegant buildings of Greek Row complete the classic college campus environment.

On the historic and pleasant campus, visitors can play 18 holes of golf among the rolling hills of the Palouse, take in the Tutxinmepu Powwow organized by the Native American Student Association, or support the Vandals with a trip to the Vandal Bookstore for sportswear and mementoes.

Special events such as homecoming, Moms' and Dads' weekends, commencement, and Vandal athletics draw in crowds of parents and community members, as well as many of the more than 100,000 Vandal alumni.

### Athletics

## NEW SAINT ANDREWS COLLEGE

New Saint Andrews College is a classical, Christian liberal arts college in the heart of Moscow. Its great books curriculum, originally modeled after 17th century Harvard, is continually refined to reflect the best of the liberal arts tradition. New Saint Andrews seeks to graduate leaders who shape culture through wise and victorious Christian living. The student-faculty ratio is kept small, allowing most lectures to pair with recitations—small groups of students in dialogue with professors, engaging closely with class material. The college boasts Christian principles and service, refuses federal aid, and is frequently rated among the nation's top classical and Christian colleges. While serving students mostly from the Pacific Northwest, students come from thirty-four states, seven foreign countries, and represent twenty-three different Christian denominations. Through their classical but forward-looking program of study, graduates receive an education for all of life and gain foundational skills for a spectrum of occupations. Graduates also go on to further studies at top schools

like Princeton, Harvard, Duke, Oxford, Notre Dame, and Vanderbilt. The college is tucked into the center of Moscow and housed in the historic Skattaboe building, its red brick walls shoulder-to-shoulder with Friendship Square. Most of the student body lives within walking distance of the college—if someone strolling Main Street is smartly dressed and speaking in Latin, chances are they attend New Saint Andrews. Students are encouraged and expected to live and work as responsible members of the community. They enjoy the food, arts, and business of downtown Moscow. The college offers a B.A. in Liberal Arts and Culture, which can be

coupled with a Certificate of Music; also offered are an A.A. and three master's degrees. The alumni work in a variety of fields, such as business, writing, law, economics, arts, teaching, technology, and the ministry. At \$12,800 a year, the school's tuition is among the lowest in the country for private colleges and universities. Private scholarship assistance is available, and freshman students have the opportunity to lock in their tuition rate for all four years. The college is accredited by the Transnational Association of Christian Colleges and Schools (TRACS), an accreditation agency

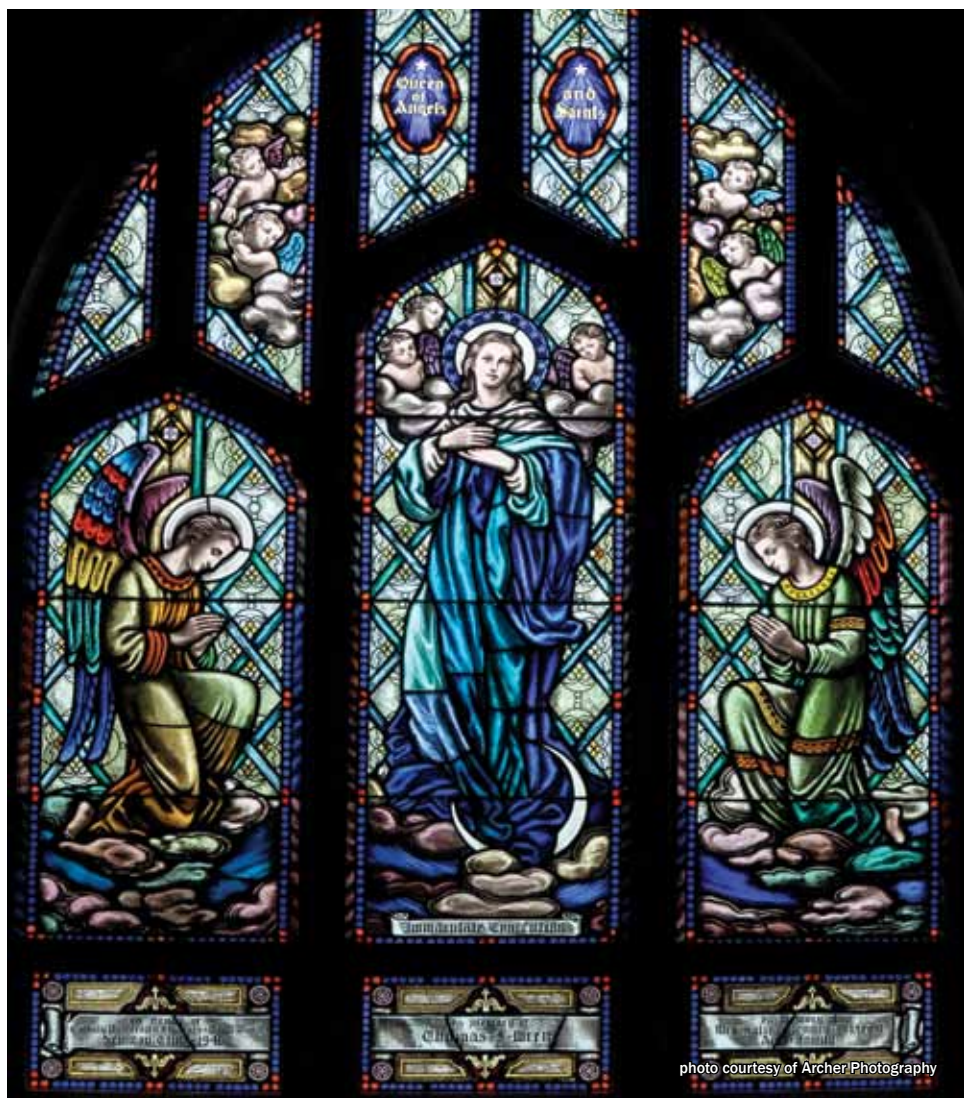

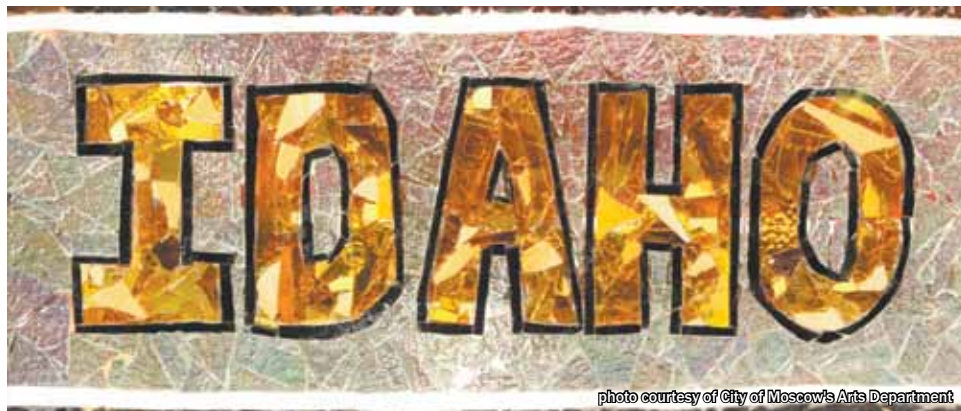
